Religious education

St. Dunstan's has a Christian foundation and the Christian values of Faith, Love, Hope, Trust, Forgiveness, Friendship, Respect, Courage, Peace and Koinonia play a central part in the life of the school.

All Religious Education and Collective Worship at St Dunstan's is in accordance with the principles and practice of the Church of England and according to the Southwark Diocesan Religious Education Guidelines. Children are also taught to respect other faiths represented in Great Britain today and are introduced to some of their basic beliefs.

Class assemblies take place during the year, when children lead the act of worship and parents are very welcome to join us. On special occasions such as Harvest, All Saints' Day, Ash Wednesday, Ascension Day, at Christmas a Eucharist service is held at school or in our parish church and parents and friends are invited to join us at these.

Members of the Cheam Team Ministry visit the school regularly and support our school through our fortnightly prayer group. Children in Year 6, who wish to, are prepared for Confirmation during the year. Visits are made to local places of worship such as St Dunstan's Church and Sutton Synagogue and those further afield such as Southwark Cathedral and visitors and speakers in school enhance the children's learning.
