Writing

Times Tables

All children should be able to recall multiplication and division facts up to 12 x 12 by the end of year 4. Keep practising these with your child.

Times Table Rock Stars is available for your child to use. They should use their login details that are in the back of their home/school books.





Multiplication Check



This is a statutory on-screen check consisting of 25 times tables questions. Your child will answer 3 practice questions before moving onto the official check and they will then have 6 seconds to answer each question.

It consists of pupils recalling their times tables knowledge up to 12 x and it is tested using on an online platform. More details to follow.

We would like to remind parents that being able to recall times tables facts up to the 12 x tables is a year 4 National Curriculum objective, independent of any test, so please support your child in achieving this.

Maths Lessons

- Maths lessons are based on the White Rose Scheme which supports the National Curriculum.
- Maths tasks are split into three sections fluency, reasoning and problem solving.

- Autumn Term place value, addition and subtraction, measurement, multiplication, division A and area A.
- Spring Term Multiplication and division B, Length and perimeter, fractions, Decimals A and area B.
- Summer Term Decimals B, Money, Time, Shape, Statistics, Position and Direction.

English, spelling and maths homework will be set on the Google Classroom on Thursday and must be completed by the following Tuesday. Children should spend around 20 minutes on each activity.
