CURRICULUM INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

Communication, Language and Literacy

We will be reading a variety of stories and rhymes. Some of our core stories: 'Pizza for Pirates', 'Mrs Pirate',

'Pirates Love Underpants', 'Yo Ho Ho A-Pirating We'll Go', 'This Little Pirate.'

The children will join in with songs and rhymes, copying sounds, rhythms, tunes, and tempo.

The children will engage in extended conversations about stories, learning new vocabulary.

The children will understand the five key concepts about print: print has meaning, print can have different purposes, we read English text from left to right and from top to bottom, the names of the different parts of a book, page sequencing.

Expressive Arts and Design

The children will continue exploring a range of sound-makers and instruments and play them in different ways.

The children will use drawing to represent ideas like movement or loud noises.

The children will be continuing to explore colour and colour-mixing.

The children will explore different textures in their artwork. The children will continue building up a repertoire of songs. The children will continue to develop confidence to perform a dance - following instructions and making up rhythms inside and outside on the stage.

Personal Social and Emotional Development

The children will continue to develop confidence to express their own needs and feelings and be able to interact with others.

The children will continue learning to share toys and to use their words when they are upset.

The children will be supported to extend their ideas during role-play activities.

The children will be encouraged to describe themselves in positive terms and talk about their abilities during circle times.

As part of their transition the children will explore what it means to be a Reception child and gain independence by dressing themselves in school uniform. (role play area)

General

Please continue to encourage your child to dress independently.

If your child is starting Reception in another school, please let us know what colour uniform they will be wearing so we can incorporate that into our transition arrangements.

Please name your child's belongings.

Please apply sun cream before coming to school. Please remember to send in photos of your child/children on a journey/holiday/park as we will be using these as prompts to encourage discussion. You can also upload them onto 'Evidence Me' if that's easier.

Maths

The children will continue to develop their understanding of the value of numbers 1-5.

The children will talk about and explore 2D and 3D shapes (for example, circles, rectangles, triangles and cuboids) using informal and mathematical language: 'sides', 'corners'; 'straight', 'flat', 'round'. (triangle, circle, rectangle, square) & mathematical terms such as corner, edge, straight, curved, point) to describe shapes.

The children will be able to find the total number in two groups by counting all the objects in both groups.

Physical Development

The children will continue using large and small motor skills to do things independently, for example manage buttons and zips, and pour drinks.

The children will continue developing holding the pencil correctly using a tripod grip.

The children will continue to develop awareness of space through different games like 'Traffic Lights', 'Mr Messy and Mr Neat', 'Jump in a Hoop', 'What's the Time Mr Wolf?' The children will use simple tools to effect changes in materials (junk modelling/ playdough tools/ hole punchers etc)

Understanding the World

The children will continue making connections between the features of their family and other families.

The children will begin to make sense of their own life-story and family's history.

The children will begin to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and all living things.

The children will talk about the changes in weather and the seasons.

The children will talk about the differences between materials and changes they notice.
