Year 2 Trip to Sutton Ecology Centre



On 20th June, Year 2 went to the Sutton Ecology centre as part of our science topic on 'Living Things

and their Habitats'. First we were each given a minibeast or insect figure and had to sort them into their correct habitats.

Then we went to the pond area where we tried pond dipping with a big net. We emptied the con-

emptied the content of the net into a tub of water and used a magnifying glass to explore the creatures we had



caught. We had an identification chart that we used to help us name the different pond creatures.

We then explored the meadow and



woodland area using a bug pot and brush to find different minibeasts. We found

spiders, caterpillars, ladybirds, beetles, snails, ants and we even saw a slow worm! It was interesting being able to look at them closely through our magnified bug pots. We had a lovely day being minibeast explorers!
