Year 2 Mini-Beast Hunt



Year 2 children had a wonderful time in Cheam Park this week, in the glorious sunshine, hunting for mini-beasts. They explored different microhabitats under logs, bushes and trees. Snails, ladybirds, millipedes, bees, butterflies.... just a few of our finds!







Year 1 really enjoyed our workshop with Nabhinandan from the Mandir in Coulsdon. We shared our knowledge of some of the deities and

learnt so much more from our discussions with him. He brought his prayer beads with him and showed us how he prayed. Did you know that there are 108 prayer beads and he says prayers for each one and goes round the whole set 16 times? Finally, after we had sung the Hare Krishna song together, he answered all of our questions we had. He was so patient, there was lots of questions!

In Year 5 RE, the children have been investigating the theme of 'The Journey of Life and Death'. The session with Nabhi was both thought provoking and interesting, as both classes engaged in deep and meaningful questioning and expressed their ideas with compassion and respect. Nabhi answered all our questions with patience and was



impressed by the both classes knowledge and listening skills.

We were taken on a spiritual journey, where we learned about items that are special to a Hindus faith, such as 'Bible- Gita'.

The children were also taught how to focus their minds to achieve their dreams through peace and calmness.
