New Summer School Meal Menu

The new Spring / Summer Menu for school dinners will start from Monday 15th April. The menu can be found on the school's website.

As you are aware, the government has decided that all pupils should be able to have a free school meal at lunchtime. This offer does not depend on your household income or whether you receive any benefits - every child in school is eligible to take up the offer.

It was found that pupils who ate a high-quality school lunch achieved better academically than those who did not. They were also more likely to eat healthier foods such as vegetables at lunchtime instead of less healthy foods such as crisps. Parents appreciate saving the cost of school lunches and not having to spend time preparing packed lunches. All children at St Dunstan's, Cheam, are offered a free school meal. Children are able to choose from having a school dinner every day, Monday to Friday, or alternatively on two days, Wednesday and Friday.

It is extremely important that if you decide to change your child's meal pattern, you inform the school office.

Multi Sports Festival


On Monday a group of our


The photographer will be in school on **Tuesday 23rd April** to take class photos. You will already have given consent for your child to be photographed.
