I am delighted to say this is the last Newsletter before we welcome ALL

children back to school on Monday. We are so looking forward to seeing you all and having our whole school family back under one roof!

I would like to pay special tribute to all parents / carers who have been supporting the children in their daily learning at home since Christmas—you have been amazing, as have all of the children, and you should all be extremely proud of yourselves.

Please remember to check the drop off and collection times for your family and we respectfully request that you do not arrive too early as we really need to prevent the paths and roads around school from becoming too congested. A reminder that all KS2 children (Years 3-6) enter through the school gate on their own in the mornings and Early Years and Key Stage 1 drop the children at the blue KS1 gate. Only 1 adult per family at any time please!

We have been extremely successful, so far, in preventing transmission of the virus within school thanks to everyone following our rules and so I do ask that everyone respects the School Risk Assessment: all adults and children of secondary school age wear face coverings on the school site at all times (unless medically exempt) and everyone stays at least 2 metres from other families at all times please. A very big thank you to all parents for helping your child find character clues that were shared both at home and at school. Miss Toms








After one week of learning all about our new topic 'Off With Her Head', Year Five are hooked!

Last Thursday, Year 6 enjoyed making a model representing of one of the chambers of the heart during our science lesson about the circulatory system.

We had to cut the neck off a balloon and stretch it over a jar which was half full of water. We then had to carefully make 2 holes in the balloon so that we could put the straws through and into the water. We needed to tape over one of the ends of the straws to make it act like a valve. (A valve in

the heart is used to keep blood that has been pumped from one chamber to another from flowing back into the chamber it came from.) Then we pushed onto the top of the stretched balloon to mimic the heart pumping blood through our arteries in a similar way.
