Reading	 Please ensure that your child reads for 15 minutes at home every day and writes this in their home/school book. It is important that children read aloud to an adult some of the time and discuss what they have been reading.
	• Please sign the home/school book every weekend to indicate that the reading has been done every day.
	 Home/school books will be checked and signed by the teacher on a Monday.
	 Please remind children to bring any notes written in the home/school book to the teacher's attention or use the class email.
Spelling	 Spelling patterns will be taught and revised during the week and may sometimes be part of the English Homework.
	 Children also need to be able to spell all of the words on the Y1/2 spelling list and we will continue to work on the spellings on the Y3/4 list.
	• Please continue to support your children in the learning of the spelling lists in the 'Home Learning Resources' folder on J2e.
Writing	 The children are expected to write in joined, legible handwriting in pencil. Throughout the year we will be building on their previous work and covering the Year 4 curriculum. Pupils will be taught how to write in different genres for a range of
	audiences and purpose.

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Times tables	 All children should be able to recall multiplication and division facts up to 12 x 12 by the end of Year 4. Please keep practising these with your child. Times Table Rock Stars is available for your child to use. They should use their existing login details from last year. (New pupils to the year group will receive a new login.)
National Multiplication Tables Check	• From the 2019/20 academic year, the multiplication tables check (MTC) was statutory for all year 4 pupils however, due to COVID-19, this test did not take place in the last academic year. We are waiting guidance regarding whether this will go ahead this year. If so, it consists of pupils recalling their times tables knowledge up to 12 x and it is tested using on an online platform. More details will follow once we have confirmation. We would like to remind parents that being able to recall times tables facts up to the 12 x tables is a year 4 National Curriculum objective, independent of any test, so please support your child in achieving this.
Maths lessons	 Maths lessons are based on the White Rose Scheme, which supports the National Curriculum. Maths tasks are split into three sections – fluency, reasoning and problem solving. Fluency tasks contain basic methods of calculation. Reasoning tasks are given to enable the children to explain their calculations and methods that they have used. Problem Solving tasks are given to enable the children to apply their learning. Mastery tasks are also used to give the children the opportunity to develop an understanding of a concept in greater depth. The maths topics covered are: place value; addition, subtraction, length and perimeter; multiplication and division; area; fractions; decimals; money; time; statistics; properties of shape; position and direction.

Homework	 English and maths homework will be set on J2e every Thursday and must be completed by the following Tuesday. Children should spend around 20 minutes on each activity. They need to save their work into their 'My Files' area where the class teacher will be able to access it and comment. Topic homework suggestions will be uploaded to J2e each half term. Children are expected to complete and save on J2e three topic homework activities by the end of the half term (before the half-term break). If pupils would like to complete a topic-related activity that is not on the suggested list, they are very welcome to do so and this will count as one of their pieces of topic homework.
