



## **Phonics**



Phonics is the system almost all schools use to teach children to read.

Phonics teaches children the link between letters and the sounds they represent.

At St Dunstans we use the Little Wandle phonics scheme.

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
# Once secure in their phonics children move on from Little Wandle to the Oxford Reading Scheme.


Children on the Little Wandle scheme will bring this book home to celebrate their reading with you *Please return on Monday*




